The Episcopal Church of the Holy Communion has been serving its community of faith for nearly six decades in Memphis, Tennessee. It began as a mission chapel in 1939. Today, the building still stands, welcoming the community to prayer.

the test of time, certain elements were due for a little touch-up in 1990. Stromberg Architectural Products supplied the ornately-capped columns that adorn the front entrance to the church. With the columns being fabricated with Stromberg's Glass Fiber Reinforced Concrete (GFRC) the replacement columns installed in 1990 can be expected to last much longer than the original columns installed in the 1950s.
